We Can Help Through

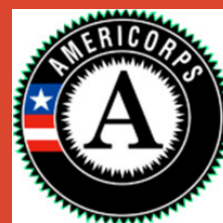
- Helping veterans who are reentering the community after a prison sentence in their efforts to connect with the resources and services they need to find a better path.
- Providing support groups to help ex-offenders connect with others who are going through similar challenges and strategize about how they can attain their individual goals. (A veteran-specific support group is coming soon!)
- Matching veterans with trained One to One volunteers who can offer friendship and support while veterans are preparing to leave prison and after their release into the community.
- Meeting with community groups discussing the challenges often faced by veterans after service in a combat zone, and the special needs of veterans returning to the community after a prison sentence.
- Identifying new partnerships to support veterans transitioning to the community.

** The Veterans Justice Program is available to ALL veterans, regardless of their combat service, the time of their service or the type of crime they were adjudicated for.*
